We represent Defendants Darren K. Indyke and Richard D. Kahn, Co-Executors of the Estate of Jeffrey E. Epstein (together, the “Co-Executors”), in the above-referenced action. We write to supplement the Co-Executors’ pending motion to dismiss (ECF Doc. 36) with the enclosed copy of the Opinion & Order entered today by The Hon. Paul A. Engelmayer in another personal injury action against the Co-Executors (*Mary Doe v. Darren K. Indyke and Richard D. Kahn, as executors of the Estate of Jeffrey E. Epstein, and Sarah Vickers*, 19-civ-10758 (PAE) (DCF)).
